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ABOUT KELVIN

Kelvin is a specialist in resolving complex infrastructure, energy and resource disputes. He is proficient at making complicated technical, delay and quantum issues, easy to understand.

He previously headed a Singapore Academy of Law Promotion of Singapore Law Subcommittee (Energy and Oil and Gas), and sits on the Building and Construction Law Committee of the Law Society.
