Foundation Scholar. He earned an LL.M. in International Arbitration & Litigation from University College London (UCL) where he represented the United Kingdom as an oralist in the UCL team that was the runner-up in the prestigious Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition.

For his *pro bono* work and expanding access to justice, Mahesh was highlighted as one of Asia-Pacific’s Innovative Lawyers at The Financial Times’ annual Innovative Lawyers Asia-Pacific 2018 awards. He was also shortlisted for the 2018 IBA Outstanding Young Lawyer Award for his *pro bono* representation of accused persons facing the death penalty in Singapore and civil-party victims before the UN Khmer Rouge Tribunal.

EXPERIENCE

Investor-State Disputes

- Representing a group of investors in a collective investor-state treaty action valued at US\$300 million against the Swiss Confederation involving the Swiss government’s unprecedented decision to write down Credit Suisse’s Additional Tier-1 bonds.
- Represented an international contractor in two UNCITRAL arbitrations against the Maldivian Government for claims over US\$155 million relating to expropriation of land and delays to a project to construct public housing over 10 islands. Issues included expropriation and several technical experts were called to opine on delay, disruption, and force majeure issues.

Mahesh is representing 370 investors to recover losses against the blockchain technology firm, its founders, and an affiliated foundation, for losses totalling US\$65.6 million arising from the collapse of the TerraUSD stablecoin.

- Obtained urgent injunctions for a prominent blockchain / cryptocurrency company in a claim against a former employee, to prohibit the disposal of tokens, disclosure of confidential information and securing a contempt conviction for the employee's disposal of tokens on the blockchain.
- Representing a blockchain / cryptocurrency company in an SIAC arbitration over the termination of a SAFT.

IT, Technology and Telecommunications

- Represented an international telecommunications infrastructure provider in one of the first telecommunications infrastructure project disputes in Myanmar. The US\$20 million dispute centred on issues such as power consumption, construction delays due to force majeure and the difficulties of building in rebel-held areas and regions affected by civil war.

arbitrations over a range of disputes, including a contract for international SMS termination and firewall management, and lease payments under separate master agreements for tower site access. The latter dispute raised complex issues around Myanmar's evolving foreign exchange regime and credit financing landscape.

- Represented a leading multinational information technology and telecommunications company in two SIAC arbitrations against the telecommunications arm of a Malaysian conglomerate over contractual disputes relating to the design, commissioning and operation of a telecommunications network, and the supply of hardware and software.

Construction
